Ape Mega-Event

Report by AndrewRJ

Our 8th-annual Going APE mega-event is three weeks away, and we are in high gear, all systems go! There are currently 537 Will Attend logs which is in line with three years ago.

- Volunteers: We are actively recruiting volunteers for all areas, and have all but a few slots filled esp. on parking. This is always the hardest area as it requires quite a few areas and few people want to work by themselves. Despite needing the VIP line, I have not added extra people to that area as we will be having the pre-event distribution event which should reduce the need. I will talk to Lisa and let her decide if she needs more.
- Equipment: We still need to put the word out to get tables and canopies. We have a few people pre-volunteering their equipment
- Swag Bag: Preorders opened in mid-June, closed July 7 and we sold 277 (100 VIP / 104 Silverback / 73 Chimp).
- Swag orders: As far as I am aware everything has been ordered and the last pieces will arrive around Aug 11.
- Swag Bag stuffing: We need to get the SWAG bag stuffing party scheduled. This will get
 all our preordered Swag Bags ready for pickup at the event. This will also be the final
 crew chief meeting before the Big Day.
- Event coin: A great design again this year with a proxy tag! and the coin here. We ordered Regular Coins: 321 Premium Coins: 204 VIP Coins: 100
- Event shirt: Ordered

- Parking: Parking will be using the plan from 2 years ago as we are expecting many attendees this year. Ranger Keith is going to let us park additional cars along the trail at Hyak (next to the event venue). We have approval to use a ski lot at the Nordic Center free! for our overflow lot. And it's just a short walk to Hyak, closer than the Forest Service lot. We will have parking attendants there to ensure that we are respecting the area and to direct folks to the trail to Hyak, and we must do a trash sweep after the event. We may have to use the upper lot as well. We need to purchase 100 Discover day passes (Hyak) and already have the NWF day passes (Forest Service lot).
- Portapotties: We are continuing to use Spiffy Biffy this year. The price will be about \$600 and we've got a confirmed order for four toilets. (Background: State Parks requires us to provide additional toilets due to the large crowd at our event. One will be on the west side.)
- Lab caches: Mc3cats is working on the prep for the Ape Adventures, which will only be live the day of the event, although folks will have a week to log them. I have heard that the Lab Caches are going to be in/twoards North Bend this year?
- Caches: The Ape Cache is being replaced with the original container. Appropriate
 meetings have been occurring between GS and the parks and a plan is in place and is
 tentatively planned for replacement the week before the event. An email will be sent to
 one of the reviewers to disable Curious Joes cache at the entrance of the park.
- Spot the Ape: I personally have nothing to do with this but it seems to be going very well.

Comments: We received permission to take a small vehicle through the tunnel and Mr. Gadget #2 volunteered his small utility vehicle for service as well as offering to drive. This will be useful in getting gear from one end to the other, as well as transporting those with disabilities or in case of emergency.

Broncos Fan 4 Life reports that Geocaching HQ has received permission to place the original APE container back in its old spot in the State Park. They are working with the park ranger on the exact date it will be replaced and how to secure it with the hopes that it doesn't go missing again. Geocaching HQ is aware of the event and they are have assured her that the APE container will be an active cache on August 19th.

Jtcoffee reports that the Spot the APE tags are being published at approximately 4/day, and will be posted up to the week before the event. People are *very* excited and committed to this game, and it's going very well (tags being found, creating excitement for the event, etc.)

Recent Outreach Activities:

On June 10th the WSGA participated in the Get Outdoors Expo that the WSPF puts on every year. This year it was held at Lake Sammamish State Park. They had a bigger turn out this year than in past years which has a lot to do with where the event was this year. The WSGA booth was buzzin pretty much the whole time we were there. We sponsored a lab adventure during the event which quite a few folks did. I had a fantastic group of volunteers helping me out this year which included names you will be familiar with. 


Overview

South Central Chapter by Tumbleweedpirates
