Figure 1. Can you tell when Spot the APE started?




Figure 2: Ape posts usually have a reach of around 400, and they're our more popular type of post this time of year.

#### **Recent Outreach Activities/Events**

#### Learn To Row Day - 6/2/18

Ellis at Geo HQ was contacted by the Lake Washington Rowing Club who is just down the street from HQ. The rowing club is having their "Learn to Row Day" on Saturday June 2<sup>nd</sup> and contacted HQ to see if they would be interested in having a geocaching booth inside their row house during the event. Deb reports that it was a cold and rainy-day Dave did a great job with the set up and of the events and even had a pop up to keep me dry in my little area. Deb reports that for the first 30 minutes she thought it was going to be a hop skipping busy fun day showing the folks the ropes of Geocaching and possible new WSGA members but after 30 minutes and 5 families (none of them went out on the cache course) it fizzled to a cold burned log as the rain got heavier and the wind battled. Another way to push merch is with an order form at an event if no wi-fi or cell service

Mc3cats> While I think it would be great to have merch at the chapter level, But with us moving away from clothing and using the Red Hat website, I think we can certainly promote that chapter wide.

rambudo> I think it would be good to have a State wide designed flyer for membership and merch to give out at events.

squirrel50> that is a complaint I heard at my event,

rambudo> I have seen issues where computers that were following links to the old website were considered spam and blocked.

Mc3cats> My concern is there likely occurred with MANY people that we do not know about. rambudo> There is also an issue with toolbars sending out "spam" traffic to the website that then get blocked. We just need another vender for spam blocking and they all cost money. Mc3cats> We need to figure out how to fix this issue. I am all ears on this.

Thats true Russell, But if we are losing membership, then we are losing money and membership. Cant have that either.

rambudo> That is why we need to drop the vender we have and pick up a new vender.

broncos> Agreed @rambudo

Martin5> I think we would be better off looking at a different one, even if we do have to pay for it

jtcoffee> What vendor do you recommend @rambudo?

Mc3cats> Russell, do you have any suggestions on a new vendor? Or Chandra or anyone else?

rambudo> I do not have a recomendation for a new vendor at this time. I have not done the research.

Terrible\_Ts> I suggest we talk to Mitch and see if he has anything in mind.

Mc3cats> I agree with both Russell and Jim.

Terrible\_Ts> I am all for changing to a new spam blocker

squirrel50> agree with Jim

Mc3cats> Chandra, would you be willing to take this issue up with Mitch? Since this will inevitably require finances and your tech background, I will like you to bring this up with him and discuss it.

broncos> Fine

Mc3cats> Great. You two can chat about it and come back to the board with what you the short term and then long term solutions would be. I appreciate it, Chandra. Thank you!

broncos> WSGA will have a booth, they need to staff it and sell

Mc3cats> I will be there for sure.

squirrel50> already said yes

PeachandPete> Deb and I can work together on this.

broncos> Your people will need a tablet with the app

Mc3cats> Ok. great. Not familiar with collect. I will provide the gear.
